Our Year in Numbers 2017-2018

We enjoyed an exceptional year in 2017-2018, with our 70th anniversary, a new name, a rebrand and a fresh website, all designed to show that we are as committed as ever to making parental engagement in children's learning and their school lives as good as it can be. Information and Training Sessions for Connect Members by Local Authority

We delivered **50** face-to-face sessions in **17** local authorities to **615** attendees. We also hosted **37** online sessions on **eight** topics with **209** attendees. The chart below shows local authorities and numbers of face-to-face sessions.

Membership-Linked Insurance

Our membership-linked insurance is one of our most popular services.

Over the past year, we have answered queries about covering Members' increasingly diverse events and projects.

We offer detailed guidance for Members on a range of topics. Queries about insurance cover included:

Our Policy Work

Connect is the only Scottish charity dedicated to supporting parental engagement with children's learning and with the school community.

This gives us a unique position and means we are regularly invited to take part in consultations run by Scottish Government, the Scottish Parliament and education partners.

In forming our consultation responses, we regularly survey parents so we can reflect different views and perspectives on issues that directly affect families.

This year we submitted consultation responses on

- Excellence and Equity for All: Guidance on the Presumption of Mainstreaming
- Empowering Schools: A consultation on the provisions of the Education (Scotland) Bill
- Early Learning and Childcare Service Model for 2020
- Protection of Vulnerable Groups and the Disclosure of Criminal Information
- Supporting Disabled Children, Young People and their Families.

Keeping in Touch

Good communication with our Members and listening to what they have to tell us is central to what we do at Connect. To this end, our new name, brand and website were successfully launched in February 2018.

We ran six online surveys on

- families experiencing financial hardship and the impact on children's school lives (394 replies)
- the Education Bill (321)
- amendments to the PVG scheme (84)
- P1 Scottish National Standardised Assessments (364)
- fair funding in schools (281)
- anti-bullying behaviour with respectme (540).

In addition

- **1984** people responded to our surveys (2000 in 2016-2017)
- around **1400** people received each of our three issues of Backchat by post - a reducing figure as Members prefer email
- **1700** subscribers received our monthly eNewsletter
- **30,000** people used our website - down only 2% despite a new website and name
- over **5000** people followed us on Twitter by July 2018
- **534** new followers for our Facebook page, increasing from **1116** to **1650**

Our Projects

Professional Learning

In 2017 we added a second professional learning module, *Family Engagement for Improvement*, to our educators' offer. We continued to run our two part *Engaging Families in Children's Education* module which is endorsed by the Scottish College for Educational Leadership. Planning took place for a third module on evaluating family engagement. Whilst sharing good practice with teachers and early years practitioners, this service is also an additional revenue stream for Connect.

Partnership Schools Scotland

Our Partnership Schools Scotland project moved into its third year. With funding support from Skills Development Scotland, Connect worked with 30 schools in eight local authority areas. The Year 3 Report is available on our website.

At our AGM and Annual Lecture on 8 February 2018, SPTC became Connect, with a fresh new website as well as a rebrand. Over 100 leaflets were rebranded too! Visit our new website at www.connect.scot

Our Staff

Connect's dedicated core staff team is based in our Edinburgh office. Our staff travel all over Scotland to deliver Training and Information Sessions to parents and Parent Councils and professional learning to education professionals.



Press and Publicity

As well as commenting on issues relating to parents and education, we generated significant publicity during 2017-2018 as a result of our Parents' Voice surveys with Sustrans on school travel, on bullying behaviour with respectme and on families facing financial hardship and the impact of this on children's school lives. As well as commenting on current issues, we also wrote features/opinion pieces and initiated press stories.
